

Acceptable Forms of ID

Two pieces of ID are required for the mandatory credit check.

Only Acceptable Forms of ID

- Canadian driver's license*
- Social insurance number + valid government-issued photo ID
- Major Canadian credit card + valid government-issued photo ID

*IMPORTANT: You CAN NOT use a driver's license for both Photo ID and Credit check.

Acceptable Forms of Photo ID

Driver's License	 Non-expired Canadian Conditions: Both the province and expiry date are required. 	
Provincial ID	 All Canadian provinces (except Quebec) Obtained via Provincial government, Motor Vehicles Branch, Registry Offices. Provincial IDs are called different names according to the province issuer:

Valid Passport	Both Canadian and Foreign accepted		
Other	 Work Visa Department of Defense ID (Canadian) Permanent Resident Card Certificate of Indian Status CNIB card (Canadian National Institute of the Blind) NEXUS card (optional, we cannot insist the customer provide us with this form of ID, however, if the customer offers, we can use it to verify the customer's identity.) Possession and Acquisition License (PAL) 		
Health care card	Some Canadian provinces have strict regulations restricting who can view, record and use a health care card as a form of picture id outside of the medical field.		
	Province	Accepted	
	British Columbia Prince Edward Island Newfoundland Northwest Territories	Yes. The customer's health care card can be used as a form of photo identification.	
	Ontario New Brunswick Nova Scotia	 It is illegal to request or record the card. Only if the customer willingly offers the card can it be used as a form of photo identification. 	
	Alberta Saskatchewan	We can only collect health care card number if the customer agrees to provide it.	

Acceptable Proof of Address documents:

-Utility bills (except telecom bills)

-Rental agreement

-Bank statement
